Each one should use whatever gift he has received to serve others, faithfully, administering God's grace in its various forms. - 1 Peter 4:10

Each of us have been given unique abilities, talents, and gifts. The questions are always, are we using the gifts God has given us? And if so, how do we use them?

I believe we are to use our gifts and talents according to how God designed us and His desire for us. We are called to be virtuous in all that we do. Many may think that the talents we use at work are to make us money. Have you thought maybe that isn't the case? That maybe gifts and talents are given to us to benefit others, and the talents of others are to benefit us. Just as our opening scripture tells us, "[...]each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others."

Virtue

In Matthew, Jesus gave us a commandment, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind," and "Love your neighbor as yourself."

Matthew 22:36-40

Let's talk look at the word virtue. The definition in the Cambridge dictionary is: a good moral quality in a person, or general quality of being morally good. Patience is a virtue. In 1 Corinthians 13:1-13, Paul lists virtues as Faith, Hope and Charity. I like to use God's character as a source of the biblical idea of virtue. It's the Holy Spirit that instills virtue in us as believers, and Christ is the model of virtue for us.

Spiritual Gifts

Now, let's look at three particular passages of scripture about spiritual gifts:

- 1 Peter 4:10-11, as referenced above.
- 1 Corinthians 12, which speaks to me personally about the diversity of gifts, and
- Romans 12:3-13, which speaks of obvious spiritual gifts, such as speaking/preaching, speaking in tongues, healing, miraculous powers, and prophecy; but also of the simpler gifts of faith, hospitality, mercy, wisdom, knowledge, generosity, service, encouragement, and leadership.

How many of us have asked, "What can I do to serve God?" I know in my younger years, I thought serving God was preaching, evangelism, or serving as a pastor or missionary. Not all of us feel equipped to lead worship or a Bible study. As the years have gone by, I've come to know that if we limit the list to only those obvious spiritual gifts referenced above, it's no wonder many Christians feel ill-equipped to do God's work. We have the desire to serve God and His people, but we don't think we possess the right gifts.

What are ordinary Christians like you and me to do? What spiritual gifts might we have that we can use to give glory to God? Think about hospitality, mercy, service, and generosity. You may be called to motivate others in the completion of goals that ultimately serve Christ. For example, by taking on a leadership position in an organization, you can use your gift to honor Christ. That is what women are doing through Women in Christian Leadership; encouraging, educating, and elevating women in leadership both for today and for the future. We're working diligently to strengthen communities of women's ministry and to provide trustworthy leadership development programs, opportunities, and resources to women. Giving God all the glory for all we do through Him. Maybe there is a place for you to serve through Women in Christian Leadership; we'd welcome and value the gifts you have to share.

In summary, we must recognize that the first step in using our gifts and talents correctly is to understand that, as Christians, we are to use our gifts in context of a moral and virtuous life. That is not always easy. We are human and God recognizes that. Thank God for His Grace.
